The eagle's presence is a good reminder that cities like Philadelphia – as well as Baltimore and others within the region – are important habitats for birds. Audubon's conservation and environmental policy work should therefore not be reserved for remote, wild lands far from people. It must extend to densely populated places.

This majestic bird also has brought a bit of joy and wonder into our workaday lives. For a few minutes, she removes us from our routines, reminding us that beauty is all around us and that we need to keep trying until we get it right.

# Terns flock to artificial nesting island in Maryland Coastal Bays

In May, Audubon helped to launch an artificial nesting island in the Maryland Coastal Bays, which is home to a breeding population of Common Terns. At this point last year, we had around 12 nests on the island. We're very excited to report that as of this week, the island is supporting 155 nests!


This extremely successful project was put in place by Audubon Mid-Atlantic, Maryland Coastal Bays Program, and Maryland Department of Natural Resources. We hope to continue to increase the breeding population of this endangered bird, as well as Royal Terns and Skimmers, by expanding the acreage of natural sand islands over time through deployment of dredged ocean sand and creating more natural nesting habitat in addition to deploying artificial floating islands. ## Conserving healthy forests across the Kittatinny Ridge

#### Audubon Mid-Atlantic Policy Update

In early July, Governor Wolf signed a Pennsylvania budget that includes more than \$696 million in Growing Greener funding, including over \$150 million to the commonwealth's Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. The inclusion of these dollars in the budget shows clear, bipartisan commitment to the commonwealth's beloved wild places. The

funds will be used to implement natural solutions that mitigate the impact of climate change, increase access to public parks for everyone, and protect critical bird habitat throughout the commonwealth. More than 1500 Audubon members reached out to legislators this spring to urge them to support this appropriations. Thank you!

Audubon Mid-Atlantic policy director, Jim Brown, represented Audubon's members in work to create a shared vision for Pennsylvania's environmental and conservation agenda. More than 30 organizations came together to create a comprehensive document to catalyze action on climate change and environmental justice in the state.
