Expanding Open Space in Carbon County, PA

Pennsylvania's Carbon County Commissioners have placed a \$10 million bond issue on the November ballot to support the preservation of open space and agricultural land in the county. Audubon staff worked collaboratively with county officials, local community organizations, and county residents on this ballot initiative. This work grew out of the Kittatinny Ridge Conservation Landscape program that Audubon Mid-Atlantic staff administers. We urge Audubon members who live in Carbon County to vote "yes" on this ballot question in November.
