

Bird Blitz 2009: Tanyard Wetlands

The Tanyard Wetlands site includes freshwater tidal wetlands along the Choptank River in Caroline and Talbot Counties. In 2009, areas along the King's Creek tributary and just north and south of that stream were surveyed by boat. Three volunteers conducted 4 surveys covering 36.5 km of transects during 9.4 survey hours (Table 1).

The results of these surveys are summarized below in Table 2, with highlighted species representing those with count totals that exceeded their state-level IBA thresholds. Remember that Bird Blitz survey totals represent minimum population estimates of breeding pairs. Actual populations are higher because not all available habitat was covered and because some birds along a route may not be counted (if they were silent and/or hidden while observers passed by). Seven at-risk species were recorded, with high counts for 3 species suggesting that there are larger populations throughout the site. These included 10 Bald Eagle, 4 Least Bittern, and 12 Least Tern (Table 5).
